Dear Friends,

Did you know that:

1. All services, public and private, begin with a prayer to the Holy Spirit. The most common form is: "O Heavenly King, Comforter, Spirit of Truth. Who are everywhere present and filling all things. Treasury of all blessings and giver of life. Come dwell within us; cleanse us of every stain, and save our souls O gracious Lord." Among the persons of the Holy Trinity, the Holy Spirit is liturgically prominent. He is described as God's 'Good, Holy and Life-Giving Spirit', whose activity makes the Eucharist, sustains the Church, and who is the source of all man's love, prayer and good work.
2. Repentance is not a thing of the moment. It is not an act for the death bed. The whole of life is repentance, the struggle to realize and co-operate with the blessing of the Incarnation. Repentance is the ongoing entry to the life of the resurrection.
3. Monsignor Joseph Raya said in his book, "The face of God", that faith and culture in Eastern Christianity is a many-sided thing, arising from three distinct cultures. It is a fusion of Greek, Latin and Eastern elements, with contributions over time from the Slav peoples and other ethnic groups. From these cultures there arose a new and particular culture: a new rite, a church with spirituality which was universal. This is the Byzantine Church which takes its name from the town of Byzantium better known as Constantinople. At the heart of Byzantine Christianity are three marks: Trinity, Incarnation, and repentance.
