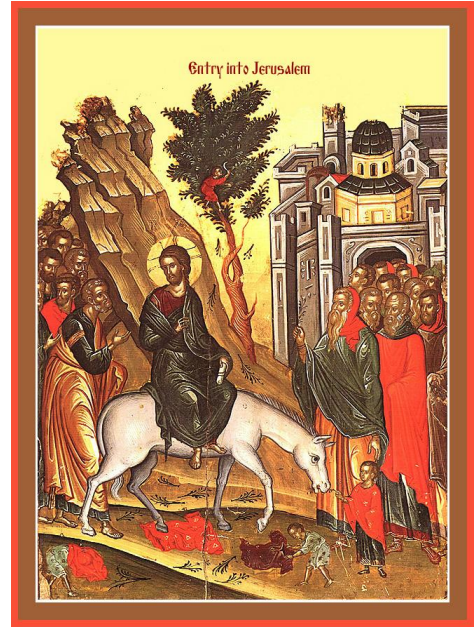

Dear Friends,

Did you know that:

1. I bear on my shoulders. It represents the lost sheep which the Good Shepherd puts on his shoulders. The lost sheep, of course, is humanity.
2. The bishop is vested with the Sakkos (outer garment) symbolizing the divine splendor of Jesus. Around his shoulders he wears the Omophorion (great stole) which signifies the Incarnation “by which Christ took upon himself our human nature and restored it to the Father”.
3. Many times during the Liturgy, the bishop blesses all those assembled. When he does so he holds two sets of candles in his hands. In his right hand, the Trikerion, a triple candle representing the Holy Trinity; in his left hand, the Dikerion, a double candle symbolizing the God-man Jesus Christ in his divine and human natures.
