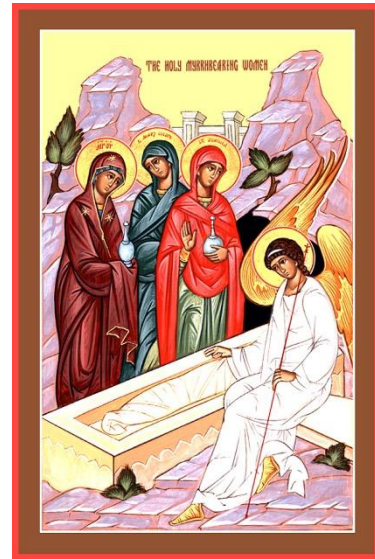

Dear Friends,

Did you know that:

1. Catholic's can go to Holy Communion in a Catholic Church of the Eastern rite at any time, such as in the Catholic Ukrainian Church, the Melkite Church or the Catholic Russian Church, but they should never attempt to do so in an Orthodox Church. Even if a Catholic has come to love the Orthodox and the East, it is better to bear the personal pain of separation than to give offense or cause embarrassment. There is a point in Catholic Canon, if for a good reason Catholics attend the Holy Liturgy in an Orthodox Church on a Sunday they have fulfilled their Sunday obligation. They do not have to go to Mass again in a Catholic Church.
2. Reconciliation has often been called a "Second Baptism" in the East, since reconciliation heals and leads to an experience of change of heart. Through praise, prayer, absolution, spiritual advice and a penance, the sacrament of reconciliation empowers a person to turn to the living God and to turn away from sin.
