Dear Friends,

Did you know that:

1. In the days of monasticism's birth in the East, some men and women went to live as hermits in the great deserts of Egypt and Palestine where they prayed for the Church and the world. Saint Anthony the Great, father of Eastern monasticism, was the first of these spiritual fathers – Geronda in Greek: Starets in Russian. Orthodox people still turn to the monks for spiritual direction.
2. The greatest center of Orthodox monastic life is Mount Athos, the Holy Mountain in North of Greece, which at one time was the home to some 40,000 monks. All of the various styles of monastic life are found on Athos.
3. An icon is a religious picture which represents Christ, Our Lady, the Saints and Angels, or the Mysteries of the Christian faith. Along with the Holy Cross, icons play a very prominent role in the devotional and liturgical life of Eastern Christians. They are neither idols nor objects of art. They are a way in which one enters the world of heaven. They are a means by which that reality is made present in life. Its place in the Church and in the home is sacramental.
