Dear Friends,
Did you know that:

1. The body of Christ.

"We, who are many, are one body in Christ" (Romans XII, 5). Between Christ and the Church there is the closest possible bond: in the famous phrase of Ignatius, "Where Christ is, there is the Catholic Church". "The Church is Christ with us." Christ did not leave the Church when he ascended into heaven: "Lo! I am with you always, even to the end of the world," He promised (Matthew XXVIII, 20), "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them".

2. The Creation

On the first day, God said, "Let there be light", and there was light, (Gen. 1:3) the light was called day, and the dark was named night. On days two and three, God separated the waters from the heavens and the earth. On day four, he placed the sun and the moon in the sky to light the earth. On the fifth day, God created the animals: "And God blessed them, saying, 'Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth.'" (Gen. 1:22). On the sixth day, God created man in his own image. When God decided that he wanted someone to till the barren fields, he gathered the dust from the ground and breathed life into Adam. Eve was then created from one of Adam's ribs while he was sleeping. Then, on the seventh day, when the heavens and earth were finished, God rested and blessed that day. This is the origin of both the Jewish Sabbath and the Christian Sunday observance.

3. Our God is an Incarnate God.

God has come down to humankind. The second person of the Trinity, "True God from True God", was made human. "The word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John I, 14). A closer union than this between God and his creation there could not be. God himself became one of his creatures.
