1. Fifty days after the Passover that ended with the crucifixion of Jesus, his followers were gathered in Jerusalem for the feast of Pentecost when “suddenly a sound came from Heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting... and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit...”. At once these unlettered Galileans went into the streets of Jerusalem to proclaim the good news about Jesus, and in response to Peter’s Pentecost sermon some 3,000 people were baptized. This was the beginning of the spread of Christianity as related in Acts of the Apostles. The numbers of baptized grew each day by day, but so did opposition to the new religion.

2. “For the Lord has chosen Zion; He has desired it for his habitation: This is my resting place for ever; here I will dwell, for I have desired it.” These verses from Psalms clearly underline the unique and powerful role that the city of Jerusalem played in the religious life of ancient Israel. Not just a place but a symbol, an idea, the Holy City provided a focal point and binding force that helped the Jews to preserve their identity over a long history.

3. The name of “Jerusalem” is derived from (YERU), meaning “foundation of” and the ancient God of the evening star (SALEM). In Genesis 14:18, the Patriarch Abraham is offered bread and wine by the Canaanite King of Salem, a place identified with Jerusalem.
