Dear Friends,  
Did you know that:

1. Isaac married Rebecca or (Rabha), who bore him twins, Jacob and Esau. When Isaac was old and blind, Rebecca tricked him into blessing their second son, Jacob, instead of Esau. Jacob then ran away from his angry brother, and he dreamed of a ladder, with the top reaching to Heaven. (Gen. 28:12). Then God appeared to Jacob and promised him all the land around him. When he reached HARAN, Jacob served his Uncle Laban for seven years, in order to marry Rachel or (Raheel). Instead he was given Leah or (Lee'a) as his bride, and had to serve another seven years to get Rachel as his second wife.

As Jacob journeyed through the desert to reconcile with Esau, he fought with an Angel for an entire night. (Gen. 32:24). Afterward, God renamed him Israel (meaning "Power with God"). Jacob later adopted and blessed his son Joseph's two sons, Manasseh and Ephraim, and from these sons were born the twelve tribes of Israel, which Moses later led out of Egypt and into the promised land.

2. Four Evangelists

Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John were the authors of the four Gospels of the New Testament, and are called the Evangelists. Matthew and John were apostles to Jesus, while Mark and Luke did not know him, writing their Gospels during the latter half of the first century. Matthew was a tax collector before being called as an Apostle by Jesus. He is depicted in many scenes of Christ's passion. John also took part in many of the stories of the New Testament and it fell to him to prophesy the Apocalypse, as told in the book of Revelations. After the ascension of Christ, John preached in Ephesus.
