Dear Friends,

Did you know that:

The Pharaoh ordered that the male children of the Hebrews should be cast into the Nile River. Yet a woman of the house of Levi choose to float her son in a basket of reeds, in the place where the daughter of the Pharaoh came to bathe. The daughter of the Pharaoh took the baby as her own, naming him Moses, "Because I drew him out of the water", (Exod. 2:10).

Moses grew to posterity as the Pharaoh's grandson until he killed an Egyptian. Then he was forced to flee to Median. There God appeared to Moses as fire within a bush, "and lo, the bush was burning, yet it was not consumed." (Exod. 3:2). Moses was charged by God with returning to the Pharaoh and taking the tribes of Israel out of Egypt.

Moses convinces the Pharaoh of his purpose with a series of ten plagues inflicted upon Egypt, which included swarms of frogs and Nile water turning to blood.

The final plague, the death of every firstborn Egyptian son, was the origin of Passover, when the Hebrews marked their doors with lamb's blood in order that their sons would be spared. The Israelites were chased to the Red Sea by the Pharaoh, so Moses "Lifted up his rod" and divided the waters, through which the people of Israel could now pass. The Pharaoh's chariots were consumed by the water; Moses continued and led the people through the desert. When they reached Mount Sinai the Lord called Moses and he received the Ten Commandments on tablets of stone.

Meanwhile, at the foot of Mt. Sinai, the Israelites had created an idol of a golden calf. When Moses returned from the mountain, he destroyed both calf and tablets. Later God finally gave Moses another two tablets offering the Laws for His people. The stories of the exodus and the Laws handed down to Moses are told in the books of Exodus, Leviticus, and Deuteronomy.
