Dear Friends,

Did you know that:

1. In addition to the Evangelists Matthew and John, there were ten other Apostles of Christ. After his Ascension, these twelve disciples became his messengers, spreading Jesus' word throughout the lands. Five of them, like Christ, were crucified; Peter and Philip were hung upside down. St. Peter was considered to be the "rock", or foundation of Christ's church, and was renamed as such by Jesus himself. Peter was involved in all the major stories of the Gospels – the Transfiguration, Christ's agony in the garden, and Christ's arrest, where he denied Jesus while the cock crowed three times. Peter went to Rome, where he was martyred during Nero's anti-Christian persecution.
2. David was the last son of Jesse, born around 100 B.C. He was appointed the first King of Israel by Samuel. When David was a young man, he played his harp well for Saul, soothing his spirit. Later David struck Goliath in the forehead, and then he cut off the giant's head with his sword. David unified the Kingdom of Israel by capturing Jerusalem, and brought the Arc of the Covenant to his capital city.
3. Joseph was the son of Jacob and Rachel, and was his father's favorite. Joseph tells his brothers of the dream he had that reveals his parents' preference for him. (Gen. 37:5). This causes his brothers to grow jealous and they sell Joseph as a slave. Joseph is taken to Egypt, and there he spurns the advances of the wife of his master, Potiphar. Eventually Joseph begins interpreting the dreams of the Pharaoh, accurately predicting famines (Gen. 41). Jacob leads the Twelve Tribes of Israel into Egypt and Joseph becomes a high ranking official of the Pharaoh's government.
